The program is structured into a one-year general program mainly offered in Rome, and a second year in other locations, focusing on alternative areas of specialisation: Children, Adults, Elderly, each referring to both the general population as well as to special groups, and dealing with such issues as:

- Health and fitness, risk factors and prevention in the general population
- Movement therapy in functional re-education & rehabilitation
- Wellness and coping in disability, chronic disorder, or other limiting conditions
- Maturation and social integration, wellness and creativity, personal growth and expression



First year - 60 ECTS

- 3. Enhancing Well-Being Through Movement Therapy and 19 Jan 10 Feb'26 15 ECTS Physical Activity for Adult
- 4.Integrated Research Methodology in Sport Sciences* 9 Mar 31 Mar'26 15 ECTS

Second year - 60 ECTS

TWO – FOUR SPECIALISATION TERMS AMONG 14 COURSES OFFERED BY THE CONSORTIUM (2 - 4 weeks of intensive theoretical and applied teaching & internship each)

May - Dec'26 30 ECTS

Specialised Courses of Applied Physical Activity for Health Maintanance, Disease Prevention and Rehabilitation (2 - 4 courses to choose from alternatives of 5 - 15 ECTS/each offered by the Rome, Vienna, Odense, Cologne and Oslo Universities. 15 ECTS international mobility is mandatory

Admission:

The program is addressed to students with an undergraduate degree in the sport science or related area, with good knowledge of written and spoken English and adequate credentials. A total of 38 students will be admitted, with possible extensions in case of qualified applications. 16 positions are reserved to students from partner universities. 5 additional positions are restricted to non-European students. Wide international participation is encouraged.

Fees & Support:

All international students are entitled to the same student assistance services as Italian students, on the basis of the same requisites of financial means and/or merit. This applies to scholarships, student loans, housing assistance, and fee waivers.

The annual tuition fees amount is payable in three instalments:

- First instalment fee: € 156,00 to be paid when you enrol;
- Second instalment fee: 50% of the comprehensive contribution, (from € 0,0 to € 1.987,65) to be paid approximately in December 2025.
- Third instalment fee: 50% of the comprehensive contribution, to be paid approximately by the end of April 2026.

First two higher candidates in the ranking lists from each consortium university will be exempted from payment of university fees but IT Services and Regional Tax DSU and virtual duty stamp (total € 156,00) provided they comply each year with specific merit requirements. Additional students from consortium universities, with the exception of Italian students, are allowed to pay taxes and contributions of the two-year course in a single fixed settlement of € 3.200.00.

Single Modules:

Candidates meeting admission requirements can be admitted to single modules on payment of € 800.00.

Applications:

Students from the Universities of Cologne, Odense, Oslo, Vienna will be selected by their respective local coordinators, subject to the number of positions available.

Students from University of Rome "Foro Italico" and all other students should submit their application and documents to the head office in Rome.

The deadline for the application is 17 July 2025 at 12:00 (Central European Summer Time). Applicants will be immediately notified about selection procedures, which will be completed by 28 July 2025.

The program starts on Monday 6 October 2025.
